PUBLIC NARRATIVE NAMES CO-PRESIDENT



CHICAGO – Public Narrative, a nonprofit organization that teaches journalists and community nonprofits better storytelling, announced today its board of directors has named Jhmira Alexander as co-president with Susy Schultz.

"We couldn't be happier to add Jhmira to our team," said Board Chair Carol Summerfield. "This is a time when engaging the media with community is more important than ever. Jhmira comes from a robust consulting business she built to teach social media and engagement.

Alexander joins Schultz and Angela Xu, operations manager, as well as six other training consultants at Public Narrative, which is the home of the Studs Terkel Award for journalists.
